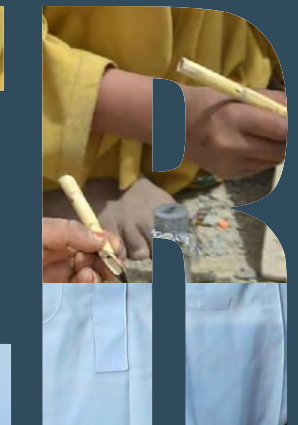
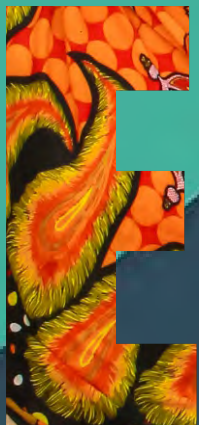
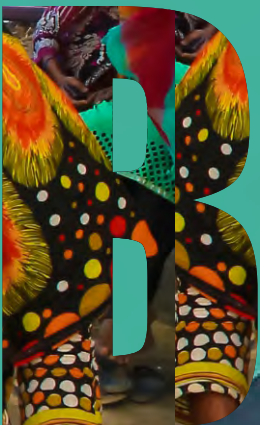
# OVERVIEW

# HIGHLIGHTS OF THE YEAR



## National Talent Hunt Programs

OGDCL, in collaboration with IBA Karachi and Sukkur IBA, has undertaken a transformative initiative to expand access to higher education for talented yet financially disadvantaged students in its operational areas. Launched in 2016, the Need-Based Talent Hunt Program (NTHP) has served as a beacon of opportunity, benefiting thousands of students. To date, approximately **2,000 candidates** have completed the two-month orientation program, with **1,173 students** (1,104 at Sukkur IBA and 69 at IBA Karachi) awarded fully funded scholarships to pursue their education at these prestigious institutions.



## Game Design Lab at Aror University

The lab at Aror University, Sukkur - Sindh, is equipped with 13 high-performance workstations featuring the latest NVIDIA GPUs, enabling students to create advanced 3D models, game environments, and simulations. The facility provides an immersive environment for both individual and collaborative projects, supporting the creative and technical demands of the game design industry.





## BETTER EDUCATION

### **Mashal-e-Elm program**

OGDCL is running a Mashal-e-Elm program in collaboration with Vision-21 for out of school children of village chapri, district Attock. The duration of the program is 4 years, inclusive of 6 months skill development training to enhance students practical skills.



### **Technical Training at NAVTTC**

OGDCL provided Technical Training to 313 youth across 13 districts in Pakistan by offering training in various diverse disciplines, ranging from Auto CAD, Auto Mechanic, Digital Marketing, Domestic electrical appliances, Heating ventilation, heavy machinery operator, industrial electrician, industrial stitching machine operator, mobile phone repairing, plumber at NAVTTC , center of excellence at Islamabad.

## ➔ Pakistan's first Mobile Eye Operation Units to Al-Shifa Trust



OGDCL donated three Mobile Eye Operation Theatre Units to Al-Shifa Trust through the company's CSR program.

The ceremonial ribbon-cutting was performed by Mr. Ahmed Hayat Lak, MD/CEO OGDCL. This donation is a commendable example of OGDCL's commitment to social causes and its support for accessible healthcare services.

## ➔ 35 free Eye Camps across Pakistan

The collaboration between OGDCL and Al-Shifa Eye Trust resulted in 35 free eye camps this year, established at OGDCL health care facilities located at fields and DHQs/BHUs, providing vital eye care to the more than **200,000** marginalized communities residing in and around OGDCL's areas of operations.



## ➔ 15 free Mammography Camps nationwide

This year 15 free mammography camps were established, and 02 females (in Attock & DG.Khan) diagnosed were referred to Cancer Care hospital for free treatment including travelling charges. The hospital will also conduct 30 more free mammography camps in the next two years, including ultrasounds in OGDCL's operational areas, with a lifelong free treatment for detected cases.

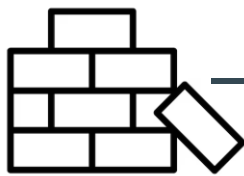


## ➔ Mobile Health Care Units

OGDCL partnered with HANDS (Health and Nutrition Development Society) to operate six mobile health units, delivering medical services to remote and deprived communities at their doorstep. These units are strategically stationed in Kohat (2), Hyderabad (2), Sukkur, and Multan at areas aligned with OGDCL's operational and exploration activities. Each unit is staffed with qualified medical professionals and is equipped with essential medicines.

## BETTER INFRASTRUCTURE

## ➔ enhancing infrastructure at BUIITEMS

OGDCL constructed state-of-the-art Record Room and constructed Drilling Rig Shade and equipment racks at Department of Petroleum and Gas Engineering at BUIITEM, Quetta.



## ➔ Chak Dams and olive orchids at Lakki Marvat

OGDCL in collaboration with the Irrigation Department of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa constructed three Chak dams in Lakki Marwat to enhance water storage and raise the water level in the region. Further, to promote sustainable agriculture and environmental conservation, planted 100 olive trees not only supports local livelihoods but also aligns with company's commitment towards environment.



## ➔ 30 resilient Homes in the villages of Jafferabad - Saiban project

OGDCL, in collaboration with Strengthening Participatory Organization (SPO), has successfully constructed 30 resilient homes in the villages of Allah Abad, Arbab Mallah, Hindu Ghot, and Ali Bughti in Jaffarabad, Balochistan.



## ➔ Construction of Pind Sultani road, Attock

Understanding the challenges faced by the residents due to poor road conditions especially during the monsoon season, OGDCL took the initiative to construct and rehabilitate the main access road, ensuring smoother, safer, and more reliable transportation.



## ➔ Upgradation of schools at Shakardara

OGDCL upgraded school located nearby Chanda field, district Kohat . This initiative, carried out in collaboration with the district government and Mouawin Foundation, aiming to provide students with a better learning environment.





## BETTER & MORE GREEN ENERGY



### ➔ Miyawaki Forest plantation nationwide campaign



In line with the OGDCL Green House Gas (GHG) Emission Policy, a nationwide Miyawaki Forest Plantation campaign successfully completed. This strategic initiative, carried out across eleven academic institutions and community centers, aims to establish dense, native forests that significantly enhance environmental sustainability and contribute to the reduction of GHG emissions. 1,070 trees have also been planted at OGDCL's facilities, contributing to environmental preservation and beautifying the company's atmosphere.

### ➔ Tree Plantation and Landscaping with CDA

OGDCL, in collaboration with the Capital Development Authority (CDA), initiated a comprehensive landscaping and tree plantation project. This joint effort aims to enhance the city's green spaces, improve air quality, and contribute to environmental sustainability.



### ➔ 30 solarized street lights at Kohat

30 solarized streetlights have been strategically installed in key areas of Kohat to improve nighttime visibility, enhance public safety, and support social and commercial activity after dark. These modern, energy-efficient lights are fully powered by solar energy, reducing reliance on the conventional grid and minimizing the region's carbon footprint.



## ➔ 150 kw Green Energy at Akhuwat College - Chakwal & Lahore



The solar facility at both campuses would supply consistent sustainable power, thus reducing operational costs and providing a stable learning environment for hundreds of students from underprivileged backgrounds. By offsetting dependence on the national grid and minimizing the use of fossil fuels, this project will also contribute to Pakistan's objectives of becoming more climate resilient and self-sufficient in terms of energy security.

## ➔ Going Solar at regional office Sukkur & Hyderabad

In a landmark move towards sustainable energy, CSR department has solarized its Regional Office Sukkur and Hyderabad, marking a significant step in company's green energy transition. These installations are the first within OGDCL's operational network to be powered by renewable energy, to reduce company's carbon footprint.



## ➔ OGDCL brings light to 1200 homes

OGDCL has successfully distributed **1,200 solar home kits (1.2MW)**, for marginalized communities across remote and underserved regions of Pakistan, significantly improving access to clean and sustainable energy where conventional electricity infrastructure is unavailable. These kits are tailored to meet the essential energy needs of households that previously lived without electricity, offering much-needed lighting and ventilation.





## BETTER CARE & KINDNESS

### ➡ Ration Drive' 25



Understanding the rising cost of food and the increasing number of families struggling to make ends meet, OGDCL launched a massive relief initiative during Ramadan this year and provided **27,000 ration bags** to deserving families residing in and around fields. The program focused on providing food supplies to the most vulnerable segments of society, so that they could observe the holy month with dignity and peace of mind.



### ➡ Embracing abilities for the disabled

OGDCL partnered with NOWPDP to establish the **Center of Excellence for Disability Inclusion (CEDI)** in Hyderabad—a pioneering hub providing comprehensive support to persons with disabilities (PWDs) through education, vocational training, assistive services, and employment facilitation.

## ➔ Impact Assessment STRENGTHENING CSR EFFECTIVENESS & ACCOUNTABILITY

- ➔ Ensuring the company's social investments are effectively meeting the needs of the communities they aim to serve, demonstrating its commitment to transparency and social responsibility, the CSR department conducted the impact of CSR work .
- ➔ The assessments were chosen based on the scope and diversity of OGDCL's CSR intervention areas, including:  
**Education, Healthcare, Clean Drinking Water, Renewable Energy, Infrastructure Development, and Livelihood Support**
- ➔ Insights obtained from the assessments are now integrated into OGDCL's CSR planning process to improve project design, monitoring, and scalability
- ➔ Recognizing the need to shift from output-based reporting to outcome and impact-oriented approaches, OGDCL, CSR department is actively working to develop customized impact assessment tools tailored to the unique nature of its CSR portfolio
- ➔ OGDCL, in collaboration with the Pakistan Centre for Philanthropy (PCP), conducted an impact assessment of its National Talent Hunt Program with IBA Karachi and Sukkur IBA. A 2-day training on "Capacity Building on Impact Assessment" was recently conducted in Islamabad attended by OGDCL, PCP, IBA Karachi, and Sukkur IBA; thus marking an important milestone in OGDCL's journey toward institutionalizing impact assessment across its Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) initiatives
- ➔ As a pilot, these impact assessment tools are initially being rolled out to OGDCL's internal CSR officials and key partners, starting with IBA Karachi and Sukkur IBA, two of the company's flagship educational collaboration partners.
